

HOUSTON (March 11, 2022) – Foto Relevance announced today that it will be exhibiting multimedia artist Alia Ali at the upcoming 2022 edition of EXPO CHICAGO.

Bryn Larsen of Foto Relevance said: "We are thrilled to be presenting the work of Alia Ali, who has received international acclaim for her photographic and multimedia work that was recently described by James Steward, Director of the Princeton University Art Museum, as "politically potent and materially beautiful." Ali's work dives headfirst into the intricate and often irreconcilable political, historical, and economic legacies of textiles. Considering everything from the expansive global trade routes traveled by certain fabrics, to the classification and nomenclature of particular prints, to the communicative potential of a pattern's symbolism, Ali guides viewers into a conversation about colonialism, cultural cross-pollination, and borders that simultaneously unite and divide people."

Ali's work has been exhibited around the world including Paris, Frankfurt, Los Angeles, Marrakech, Dubai, and solo shows at the New Orleans Museum of Art in Louisiana and the Benton Museum of Art California. In two weeks she will be revealing her first publicly commissioned artwork supported by the Andrew Mellon Foundation at the Arab American National Museum, Detroit, and will also be presenting her work in London, Paris and Venice in the next 4 months. Her work is also in numerous private collections and public institutions including the British Museum in London and the Princeton University Art Museum in New Jersey.

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In December 2021 at Art Basel in Miami, Ali was announced as an Artsy Vanguard Artist. This prestigious annual list of 20 emerging artists identifies "The most influential talents shaping the future of contemporary art practice." Her striking studio portraits have also recently featured in the Financial Times, Le Monde, Art Review, Vogue, Elle and Hyperallergic.

ABOUT THE ARTIST:

Alia Ali (Arabic: عاليه علي) is an award-winning Yemeni-Bosnian-US multi-media global artist who has traveled to sixty-seven countries, lived in and between seven, and grown up among five languages. Her practice explores and rescinds accepted cultural binaries, challenges culturally sanctioned oppression, and confronts the dualistic barriers of conflicted notions of gender, politics, media, and citizenship. Her migrations have led her to process the world through interactive experiences and the belief that the damage of translation and interpretation of written language has disserved particular communities, resulting in the threat of their exclusion, rather than a means of understanding. Through her practice, Ali critiques linguistics and inherited political structures and narratives, while simultaneously attempting to counter the polarization and miscommunication that imperils communities across the world, encouraging viewers to confront their own prejudices. Working between language, photography, video, textile, and installation, Ali's work addresses the politicization of the body, histories of colonization, imperialism, sexism, and racism through projects that take pattern and textile as their primary motif.

A graduate of Wellesley College and the California Institute of the Arts, Ali lives and works in and between Los Angeles, New Orleans, and Marrakech, and recently concluded a residency at the Roswell Artist-in-Residence Program (RAiR) in New Mexico.
