Through her work, Mélina Bismuth explores and questions the boundaries between photography and painting. Her photographic expression is rooted in the word “rebuild”, through assembling and collage.

The fine perception of colors and the mastery of their assembling is a common thread throughout her professional career. Fifteen years spent in the worlds of embroidery then jewelry, Place Vendôme, have nurtured her aesthetic universe. In her practice, she harmoniously brings together many photographs as a jeweler would be setting stones.
